THE FIFTH WORLD BY ALICE BOYLE

54 The Gallery, Mayfair, London, W1J7QX Exhibiting: 17th – 22nd February 2015



'The Fifth World', is a new collection of paintings by Alice Boyle, inspired by the power of dreams, mythology and the collective unconscious. Alice uses textures, vivid colours, shapes/symbols and layering techniques, aiming to stimulate the senses and to make the viewers more in tune with their psyches. Alice explores the eternal and intrinsic search for individual wholeness through the process of art and creativity. She purposely avoids pinning herself down to a single style to emphasize that creativity and life are more about the journey than about the end result.

'I want people to feel there is a Joy and playfulness within my work and that comes from living in the moment and enjoying the process'.

Alice's work is primarily driven by her attraction to texture. She uses layers of plaster onto hardboard because this process and the artworks themselves then have a sense of the primitive, giving the feel of pictograms, paintings or petroglyphs of ancient caves. Alice makes marks into the plaster with, knifes, combs, forks, and the ends of paintbrushes, forcing her to be spontaneous as the final layer of plaster dries in roughly 2 minutes. It commands her right from the start not to be too precious and to let her piece take on its own life which may be a little beyond herself; something which she cannot necessarily fully explain.

'I need my artworks to surprise me and have an element of unpredictability to them. I enjoy scraping the colour back off the paintings as much as I take pleasure in putting it on. I like the marks that are left behind'. An idea for a painting may develop and emerge as I am creating it.

Carl Gustav Jung once said that there were things in his dreams that came from somewhere beyond himself, 'The Collective Unconscious', which he claimed held the entire psychic heritage of mankind. Alice likes the idea that we can tap into the past through our dreams. It makes her feel connected to the world, which is then reinforced by reflecting these ideas in her paintings.

'I'm interested in a surreal world; magic and the occult and I hope this exhibition creates an atmosphere that evokes this'.
